- A. There are many **h**_____ around. It is fair to wonder about the *authenticity* of the Bible.
- B. Could the NT be simply the invention of creative minds?
- C. What would be necessary to pull off such a **f**_____?

I. YOU WOULD HAVE TO BE FAR REMOVED FROM THE ORIGINAL EVENTS.

- A. Otherwise there would be too many **w_____**
 - 1. The NT is filled with "eye witness" testimony.
 - 2. "We have heard with our ears, *seen with our eyes* and our hands handled" (I John 1:1).
- B. We have good **m**_____ evidence to prove an early date in the John Rylands Fragment of Jn 18.

II. YOU WOULD HAVE TO CAREFULLY AVOID SPECIFIC DETAILS.

- A. Details change over time and are very easy to get mixed up.
- B. It is wise to avoid specific names, places, elevations, etc.
 - 1. However the NT is filled with many **d**____
 - 2. Luke and John provide us with many specifics.
 - a. "Five pillars in the temple" (Jn 5:2).
 - b. "Gallio was proconsul of Achaia" (Acts 18:12).

 - 1. All had to be unified in teaching, thought, and doctrine.

- C. What would have been the **m**____?
 - 1. The authors did not receive riches and fame.
 - 2. No, they received ridicule, poverty, and death.
 - 3. People die for what they know to be the truth, not a lie.
- D. Does it make sense that books exalting the highest ethical conduct in history were themselves all a bunch of charlatans?
