Introduction:
Nehemiah gives us a four part formula for a prayer for building:
I. WE MUST COME TO GOD FOR PRAISE (Neh 1:5-6).
A. Nehemiah begins: God is great and God is a (Neh 1:5-6).
B. David: "Holy and r is Thy name" (Ps 111:9).
II. WE MUST COME TO GOD WITH CONFESSION (Neh 1:6-7, I John 1:7-8).
A. "We have sinned against Y" He identifies with people.
B. "He that covers his transgressions will not prosper, but he that
cwill find mercy" (Prov 28:13).
C. "If I regard iniquity is my heart the Lord will not h" (Ps 66:18).
III. WE MUST RELY UPON THE PROMISES OF GOD (Neh 1:8).
IV. WE MUST COMMIT TO PERSONAL INVOLVEMENT (Neh 1:11).
A. Satan trembles when a man says: "Here am I Lord, send m " (Isa 6:8).
B. One obstacle today to meaningful prayer is busyness.
C. Another great obstacle to meaningful prayer is p
D. Nehemiah's name means: "The Lord is my comfort." He recognized he was not sufficient.

A. It reaffirms the sovereignty of God.
B. Reestablishes our identity.
