Intro.
<ul><li>A. "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).</li><li>B. "Do not neglect doing good and s" (Heb 13:16).</li></ul>
I. COMMON GENEROSITY (Prov 11:25, 22:9, Ecc 11:1).
II. ANONYMOUS "SECRET" GENEROSITY.
<ul> <li>A. "Don't let your left hand k what your right hand is doing" (Matt 6:3-4).</li> <li>B. "Freely received, now freely give" (Matt 10:8).</li> </ul>
III. SPONTANEOUS GENEROSITY.
<ul> <li>A. "If you are not generous with a l, you won't be generous with a lot."</li> <li>B. This is not planned, but it is a decision to be this type of person.</li> <li>C. Reflected in h (Lk 14:12-14) and in visiting (Jas 1:27).</li> </ul>
IV. DISCIPLINED GENEROSITY (PROV 3: 9-10).
<ul><li>A. It is a decision to put first things first and to honor God.</li><li>B. It requires careful planning as you have p (I Cor 16: 1-2).</li></ul>
V. SACRIFICIAL GENEROSITY (2 SAM 24: 24-25).
<ul> <li>A. Our gifts must c us something to mean something (2 Sam 24:24-25).</li> <li>B. Mary came with a vile of precious ointment valued at a year's worth of workman's wages (John 12:1-8).</li> </ul>
<ol> <li>J complained and said it could be used for the poor.</li> <li>Jesus: "You always have the p with you, but you do not always have Me" (Jn 12:8).</li> </ol>
C. Often done in connection with a special need (Acts 4: 34-35).
Conclusion:

A. When we give our time, treasure, and talent to the cause of

Christ, there is no **l**\_\_\_\_\_ to what God can do!

B. May we all pray fervently for God's blessings (Jas 5:16).
