"Judge not lest you be judged." Matt 7:1

Is Religious Controversy Wrong?

- Not to be "argumentative" (2 Tim 2:24) or "divisive" (Titus 3:10).
- - Jude 3 "Contend earnestly for the faith."
 - Phil 1:7 Paul said he was set to "defend and confirm the gospel."

Is Religious Controversy Wrong?

What about Christ and the Apostles?

- Christ was in a series of controversies.
 - Matt 22:5-46-- Pharisees
 - Lk 21 "The day of controversy."
- The book of Acts . .
 - Acts 7 (Stephen)
 - Acts 17 (Paul)

Must Have The Right Attitude!




- "Speak the truth in love" (Eph 4:15).
- The Lord's bondservant must not be quarrelsome, but be kind to all, able to teach, patient when wronged, with gentleness correcting those who are in opposition" (2 Tim 2:24-25).

The Right Attitude

Col 4:6 "Let your speech always be with grace, as though seasoned with salt, so that you will know how you should respond to each person."








- How does this fit?
 - II Cor 13:5 "Prove (test) yourselves whether you are in the faith."
 - I Thess 5:21 "Prove (test) all things, hold fast to that which is good."

Must Have Balance

Examine the "Judge Not" Text

- Matt 7:1-6 "Judge not, lest you be judged. 2 "For in the way you judge, you will be judged; and by your standard of measure, it will be measured to you."
- 5 "You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother's eye."

What is Jesus Warning Against?

- Hypercritical, self-righteous judging.
- Condemns one kind and commands another!



- Matt 7:6 "Do not give what is holy to dogs, and do not throw your pearls before swine."
- Matt 7:15-16 "Beware of the false prophets!

On what basis are we to judge?

• "You will know them by their fruits" (Matt 7:16).



Good and Bad Judging

Jesus: "Judge not according to appearances but judge righteous judgment" (Jn 7:24).


Do not judge me by my skin color, my hair color, my body size and my outer beauty. If you do, you will miss entirely who I am.

Good and Bad Judging

- "Righteous judgment" is commanded!
 - Jesus: "And why do you not even on your own initiative judge what is right (Lk 12:57)?

Christians Are to Make Judgments


But a natural man does not accept the things of the Spirit of God, because they are spiritually appraised. But he who is spiritual appraises all things (1 Cor 2:14-16).

Christians are to Make Judgments

Phil 1:9-10 And this I pray, that your love may abound still more and more in real knowledge and in all discernment, 10 so that you may approve the things that are excellent.

Common Fallacy

Don't point out other people's flaws because you're not perfect! You have to look in the mirror before you can look out the window.



Saints Will Judge The World!

- 1 Cor 6:2-6 2 Or do you not know that the <u>saints will judge the</u> <u>world</u>? If the world is judged by you, are you not competent to judge the smallest matters?
- 3 Do you not know that we will judge angels?

Truth or Consequences . .

- If one can't judge others, then . .
 - We must quit preaching against sin!
 - The church is <u>condemned for doing</u> the very thing Christ praised it for doing (Rev 2:2-3).
 - The church could <u>never practice</u> <u>church discipline</u> (I Cor 5).

Summary:

- Condemns fault finding, hypercritical treatments of others.
- Taught us to be "Fruit inspectors" based upon evidence!
- Use His Word (Jn 12:48).
- Bear the infirmities of the weak and not to make "my conscience your guide" (Rm 14-15)!

Christ = *Ultimate Judge*

- The Lord, the righteous Judge" (2 Tim 4:8).
- This is the One who has been appointed by God as Judge of the living and the dead (Acts 10:42-43)."
- Acts 17: 31 "He will judge the world in righteousness through a Man whom He has appointed."
